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PUBLIC MEETINGS TO INFORM RESIDENTS ABOUT POTENTIAL DISASTERS THAT COULD IMPACT HAMILTON COUNTY

HAMILTON COUNTY, OHIO – Hamilton County Emergency Management and Homeland Security Agency (EMHSA) will be hosting two public information and planning sessions to gather input from Hamilton County residents regarding potential emergencies and disasters that could impact the County. These sessions are part of the All-Hazard Mitigation Plan, which is undergoing a mandatory 5-year update. The public meetings will be held on the following dates and locations:

- Tuesday, January 30, 2018 at 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. at the Main Branch of the Cincinnati-Hamilton County Public Library (800 Vine Street, Cincinnati, OH, 45202)
- Thursday, February 8, 2018 at 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. at the Evendale Recreation Center (10500 Reading Rd, Evendale, OH 45241)

“Hamilton County is committed to ensuring the safety and well-being of its residents and the reduction of disaster-related damages from both natural and manmade hazards,” Nick Crossley, Hamilton County EMHSA Director said. “The public’s participation will assist our emergency preparedness staff in identifying which hazards are of most concern to our residents and businesses. The public meetings will also help us identify and prioritize the services, disaster-related projects, and capabilities the community may need during an emergency.”

The two meetings will provide the public an opportunity to review the potential hazards that could occur within the County, and will request input for the various mitigation measures intended to eliminate or reduce the negative impact of those hazards.
